1.0 This addendum is incorporating the following questions and answers and clarifications to the above-referenced RFP.


The following questions were posed by one or more Vendors in writing.

1. **Q:** In section 0500, Scope of Work, under 5.C.3, it states that the bidder shall submit a copy of their current City of Austin Wrecker Permit with their proposal. This permit no longer exists. Please confirm.
A: That is correct. The City of Austin Wrecker Permit no longer exists and therefore is no longer required to be submitted with the proposal.
2. **Q:** In section 0500, Scope of Work, under 3.A.3, it references Chapter 643 of the Texas Transportation Code. Chapter 643 has since been replaced. Please clarify.
A: Chapter 643 of the Transportation Code has been replaced by Chapter 2308 of the Texas Occupations Code. Please use Chapter 2308 instead of Chapter 643.

2.0 **Section 0500 – Scope of Work: Page 4; section B, first paragraph** – “No storage fees may accrue until the 25th hour after impoundment. Contractor shall not charge a fee, or assess a fee for a service, which is inconsistent with guidelines established in the Storage Facility Act (Texas Occupation Code, Chapter 2303), or Rules and Regulations Relating to Vehicle Storage Facilities; Tex. Administrative Code, Section 16 Part 4 Chapter 85 and 86.” is hereby **CHANGED IN ITS ENTIRETY** to “No storage fees may accrue beyond what is specifically allowed under state law Texas Occupation code Chapter 2303 and 2308 and/or Rules and regulations Relating to Vehicle Storage Facilities; Texas Administrative Code, Section 16 Part 4, Chapter 85 and 86.”
